Sec. 16.05.340. License and tag fees. (a) Fees for licenses and tags are as follows:

- (1) Resident sport fishing license.....\$29
 However, the fee is 50 cents for a resident who is blind.
- (2) Resident sport hunting license.....\$45

Sec. 16.05.403. SPECIAL LICENSES AND PERMITS . (a) A resident hunting license, a resident sport fishing license, a resident subsistence fishing permit, or a resident personal use fishing permit indicating that the purchaser is blind may be obtained from the department upon payment of the fee prescribed in AS 16.05.340 and upon presentation of either an affidavit of the applicant stating that the applicant cannot distinguish light from darkness or an affidavit signed by a licensed physician or a licensed optometrist stating that the applicant's central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with correcting lenses or that the applicant's widest diameter of visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees.

PLEASE NOTE: If you have another resident holding a valid hunting and/or fishing license to take game and/or fish on your behalf, that person must: 1) possess your license; 2) harvest ticket, tag, or other document required by law as a condition of taking game and/or fish; and 3) a proxy authorization form issued by the Department of Fish and Game.

A resident may not take or attempt to take fish or game by proxy for more than one person at a time.
